In these unprecedented times we want to keep you all updated on our current position and assure you of our intentions to keep supplies of feeds and other farm inputs available to you all. Kynan Massey explains some of the actions we are taking.

#### **Key Industry workers**

Farmers and the supply chain are quite rightly, designated as key workers, and we need to work together to ensure home produced food reaches the consumer. With this comes some serious responsibilities. We must try to keep production up without compromising the health of our families, employees and those we do business with.

#### **Feed Supplies**

We have seen massive demand for our feeds in recent weeks as many farmers seek to build a reserve stock of feed just in case. We are pleased to supply extra to accommodate this but would not like to think that anyone is stockpiling and we will query excessive ordering to check the needs.

The worldwide market for feed ingredients has firmed considerably in the last two weeks with Hi-Pro Soya over £380 /tonne ex-docks. Hopefully this is short lived but we need to think about what we can do to help.

We will be looking carefully at the protein levels in dairy diets as soon as cows are out. We will keep feed price rises to an absolute minimum but will never compromise on the quality of ingredients. It will be as important as ever to keep up production as efficiently as possible.

#### **Staff and Haulage** Our objective is to continued to maintain

Our objective is to continued to maintain high levels of service across all our mills, whether in production, customer services or deliveries. However, we are constantly planning for a situation where we have a number of staff off, either sick, self-isolating or caring for household relatives.

When delivering products on-farm, while always respecting social distancing, our drivers will practice good hygiene and not touch any of your surfaces. Our drivers will not operate any of your machinery, so you will need to have someone available to unload the bags or to see the cake is blown in as you want it. To help you, we will call ahead with an estimated arrival time.

Markets have become very volatile (see table). Raw material stocks look good at source but logistics is becoming the biggest worry with ships being delayed, making it harder to get commodities where they are needed.

With the lack of movement in the world at the moment the oil price has crashed and ethanol along with it, leading to plants cutting down on production. In addition, rape crushers look to have thrown in the towel as crushing margins do not meet their requirements. This has caused mid protein prices to soar over recent weeks.

Hopefully the volatility will dissipate and lead to prices returning to a more reasonable level, but we will need help from currency and good availability of raw materials.
